Do you know what a syllable is? It is a part of a word that contains only one vowel sound. You can count the number of syllables in a word by clapping for every vowel sound. For example, for the word September, you would clap three times. Sep-tem-ber.

Try clapping for a few more words. Vegetable (ve-ge-ta-ble) Lollipop (lol-li-pop) Banana (ba-na-na) Television (te-le-vi-sion) How many times did you clap for each word?

Now that you know what a syllable is, let's write some haikus. Haikus are 3-liners that have a 5-7-5 syllable scheme.

Worried about stares? (5) I worry about stairs too (7) Let us climb the ramp (5)

You light up when you Hear your native tongue We also light up!

You see with your eyes Blind people who touch to 'see' 'See' with their fingers.

Now you write some of your own... Make sure you count the number of syllables in each line. Remember, syllables are not words. Count the number of syllables in your line by clapping.

Do you want to really challenge yourself? Try TOLERANCE or REHABILITATION.
